INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES

1. You should have the following for this examination:
 - (a) plain medium weight fabric $1\frac{1}{4}$ metres long by 152 cm wide;
 - (b) over garment flat blocks and one piece sleeve block size 140 (10 years) in full scale;
 - (c) fusible interfacing 50 cm by 50 cm;
 - (d) thread to match the fabric;
 - (e) brown papers;
 - (f) sewing tools;
 - (g) one large envelope;
 - (h) one button 1.5 cm diameter without a shank.

2. At the end of the examination:
 - (a) Stitch on a label bearing your name and index number on a single layer of fabric.
 - (b) Enclose the garment in the envelope provided.

TASKS

1. Using the size 140 (10 years) overgarment and sleeve blocks, produce final patterns for the blazer style sketched below.

NB. Spend minimal time on preparation of patterns.

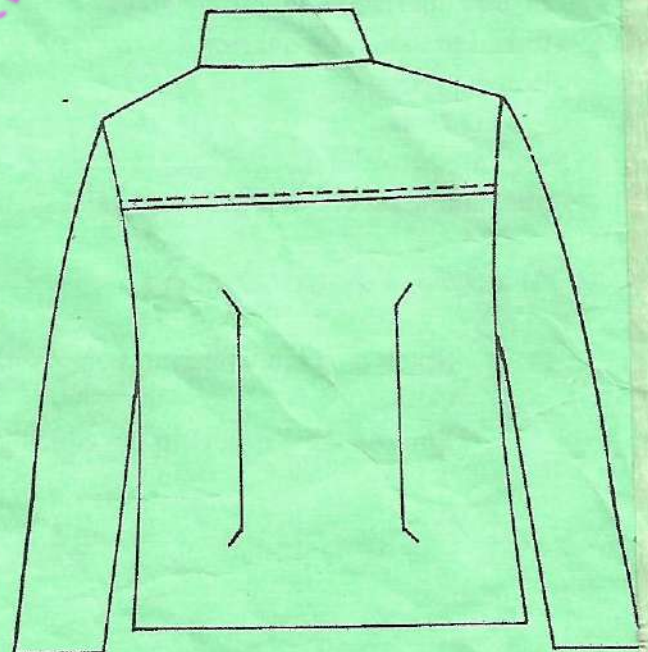
2. Using the materials and the prepared patterns, cut out and make the garment as follows:
 - (a) use plain open seam at the sides, shoulder and under arm;
 - (b) make one hand worked button hole at the break point and sew on a button;
 - (c) hand hem the garment;
 - (d) fix the yokes with overlaid seam.

Measurements:

sleeve length	-	56 cm
full length	-	54 cm
wrist width	-	25 cm
pocket mouth length	-	12 cm
